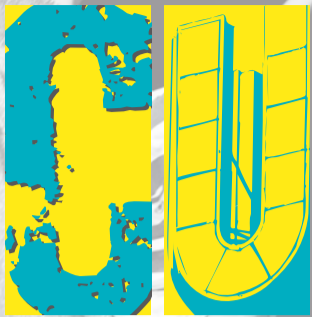

All types of creative activity are welcome: music, dance, theatre, painting, photography,

There will also be special workshops with plenty of chances for participants to discover new skills and expand their creativity. Of course, there will also be plenty of fun to be had, not to mention prizes to be won – with a total value of 20,000 euros. ## WHAT IS IT ALL ABOUT?

The aim of this competition is to give children and young people a platform on which they can present their ideas and projects. It also aims to attract a pan-European audience for exemplary children's and youth work and thus to stimulate communication and exchanges regarding project ideas and know-how.

All projects are eligible to win a prize, no matter what field of artistic activity they involve. Entries should seek to show what it is that stimulates and motivates young people today, and what they see as the main aspects of their lives and their environments. There are no limits to the possible themes.

## WHAT PRIZES ARE ON OFFER?

Applications can be submitted for projects conducted between 2008 and 2010, in the following four award categories:

### 1. RUHR.2010 Young Europe Award

The RUHR.2010 Young Europe Award honours exemplary cultural projects for children and young people which fulfil at least one of the following criteria:

- They must display a thematic reference to Europe
- They must display a thematic reference to RUHR.2010 European Capital of Culture
- They must have been performed as a collaboration between a European project and cooperation partners from the Ruhr Area

The call for entries is directed at all interested groups and individuals, anywhere in Europe.

### 2. Youth Culture Award NRW

The Youth Culture Award is given in recognition of exemplary cultural activities, conducted either singly or continuously, by and with young people in North Rhine-Westphalia. Simultaneous participation in the Young Europe Award is also permitted.

### 3. Children's Culture Award NRW

The Children's Culture Award is given in recognition of exemplary cultural activities, conducted either singly or continuously, by and with children in North Rhine-Westphalia (with a majority age of under 14). Simultaneous participation in the Young Europe Award is also permitted.

### 4. Online Award

In addition, all applicants may submit their projects for public voting in an online competition for the best web presentation. For more details on how this additional competition for the Online Award 2010 works, please visit our homepage: [www.seeyou-festival.net](http://www.seeyou-festival.net).

A total of 20,000 euros in award money is being made available to winners. As far as possible, the aim is for the prize money to be invested in future projects.

## HOW DO I APPLY?

To take part in the competition, you must send us the following:

- The completed application form,
- Convincing and expressive documentary materials suitable for enabling the jury to make its initial selection (photographs, DVDs, CDs, videos, objects, documentation in the form of words, images or sound, press articles, etc.)
- A CD-ROM etc. containing one selected, digitised project photograph along with brief descriptions of the project (please note the information on the application form).
- By submitting their application, participants declare bindingly that no third party rights (e.g. from book or music publishers etc. or from private individuals) exist with respect to the submitted projects.

The closing date for entries is 30 April 2010 (date of postmark).

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO TAKE PART?

Children, young people and anyone actively involved in the field of culture for children and young people. Participants can be individuals, initiatives, groups, or private or public institutions. School projects are also eligible, provided they are conducted outside regular classes.

## WHO SELECTS THE PRIZE WINNERS?

Prize winners will be selected by an independent jury, composed of children and young adults as well as experts. The winners will be announced during the festival.

The jury will base its decisions on the following criteria:

- Children or young people were significantly involved in the conception and development of the project and were stimulated into conscious cultural activity
- Their cultural skills were encouraged by the project
- The project has strengthened their ability to organise themselves and determine their own progress
- The projects were based on the children and young people's own general circumstances, locations, everyday life and cultural practice
- The project has shown children or young people that they are able to fashion their own everyday lives and influence their realities.
- The project has dissolved initial contact fears and children and young people have been given access to further cultural facilities and activities.
- As a result of the cooperation, the project has contributed to the formation of activity networks.

## ENCOUNTER PROGRAMME

Young people applying for one of the prizes can also apply for a place on a four-day workshop and encounter programme. Between 16-19 September, a variety of exciting activities are planned in and around the Dortmund "U", as part of the SEE YOU Festival. More than 300 youngsters from all over Europe will take part in workshops with professional artists, and meet with other people of their own age. They will have the opportunity to take part in theatre, dance and film making, as they discover the Capital of Culture, discuss their experiences, and enjoy being part of the festival.
